How to prepare vegetables for exhibition: Choose medium size carrots, potatoes, beets, etc. free from blemish. Cut off tops of root vegetables leaving one inch. Consider uniformity. DO NOT cover with plastic wrap. TOMATOES: Stems must be attached.

#63 3-2-1 Coffee Mug Cake*

Mix 2 cake mixes together in a large Ziploc bag – **1 must be angel food mix**. To bake: add 3 tablespoons of the cake mix to 2 tablespoons water in a microwavable mug. Stir well. Microwave for 1 Min. Let rest for 15 min. to cool down. Run a knife around mug and turn upside down. (*This is a fun activity to do with young children to help learn measurements and baking without chance of burning themselves. Use your imagination on the flavours – chocolate, spice, banana, strawberry, lemon, red velvet, etc.*)

#64 Spider Cookies**

1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chipits
 1 cup butterscotch chipits
 2 ½ cups Chinese noodles (not crushed)
 Put both types of chipits in large bowl. Microwave on high 2 minutes or until mixture is smooth when stirred.
 Add Chinese noodles and stir to coat well.
 Press 1 miniature marshmallow or candy on cookie to represent the head, if you wish.
 Drop by spoonful on waxed paper. Chill.
